A

BILL

to authorise payment and appropriation of certain sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Goa for the services and purposes of the financial year 1999-2000.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of Goa in the Fiftieth Year of the Republic of India as follows:---

1. Short title.— This Act may be called the Goa Supplementary Appropriation Act, 1999.

2. Issue of Rs. 67,33,60,000 out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Goa for the financial year 1999-2000 — From and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Goa, there may be paid and applied sums not exceeding those specified in column (5) of the Schedule amounting in the aggregate to the sum of sixty seven crores thirty three lakhs and sixty thousand rupees towards defraying the several charges which will come in course of payment during the financial year 1999-2000 in respect of the services and purposes specified in column (2) of the Schedule.

3. Appropriation. — The sums authorised to be paid and applied from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Goa, by this Act shall be appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the Schedule in relation to the said financial year.

Financial Memorandum

Provision is made in the Bill to appropriate for certain services and purposes expressed in the Schedule during the financial year ending 31st March, 2000 a sum of Rs. 67,33,60,000 over and above the amounts granted for those services for the financial year 1999-2000. The amount mentioned above consists of Rs. 19,19,39,000 on Revenue Account and Rs. 48,14,21,000 on Capital Account.

This Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 205(1) read with Article 204 of the Constitution of India to provide for the Supplementary Appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Goa of the moneys required to meet the amount required on certain services during the financial year, 1999-2000 in excess of the amounts granted for those services.
